## Do You Know the Secret to Joy?

## 1) Philippians 3: 1 – 8 NKJV

Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. For me to write the same things to you *is* not tedious, but for you *it is* safe. <sup>2</sup> Beware of dogs, beware of evil workers, beware of the mutilation! <sup>3</sup> For we are the circumcision, who worship God in the Spirit, rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh,

- 2. What does the Apostle Paul call the flesh?
- 3. Why did Paul count all things as rubbish to gain Christ? What does that mean for us?

## 2) Philippians 3: 8 – 11

- 1. Why would being found in Him having our own righteousness keep us from knowing Christ and His righteousness more intimately?
  - 2. Why is it important to know Christ's righteousness?
- 3. Do you think that experiencing the free gift of Christ's righteousness and knowing His resurrection life give us joy?

## 3) Philippians 3: 12 – 14

<sup>12</sup> Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. <sup>13</sup> Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing *I do,* forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, <sup>14</sup> I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

- 5. If we are already complete in Christ Jesus (Col 2:10) in our spirit, can the reality of Jesus manifest more and more in our souls and lives here on earth?
